Lesson 3: Dolphins have lots of fun! Teacher's Guide

Introductory Activities

- 1. Show a picture of a dolphin. Let students share what they know about dolphins. Teach the word in English. Tell students they will find out about a dolphin named "Daisy." Tell them what "Daisy" means.
- 2. Ask students to think of animals that help people. Make a list on the board of animals, and what they can do for people. The list might look like this:

• DOGS: save people, help the blind, find lost people and things

• HORSES: help in farming, can ride

• MONKEYS: help people who can't use their hands

• ELEPHANTS: help build things

Ask students if they think that dolphins ever help people.

Expansion Activities

- 1. Watch a video about dolphins (in English!).
- 2. Have students make posters with words describing dolphins. Descriptive words could include: graceful, smooth, big, happy, fun, helpful, fast, good swimmers, good at throwing and catching a ball.
- 3. Have students bring in pictures, toys, or figurines of dolphins. See how many dolphins the class can collect. Mount a display of dolphins, and invite other teachers and students to come and see it.
- 4. Have students do research about dolphins. Have students work together in various groups to create posters. Each group could research one aspect of dolphins:
 - Body: how they move, digest food, reproduce, etc.
 - Intelligence and activities
 - Habitat: where they live, what they eat.
- 5. Talk about other animals with healing powers. Does petting a dog or cat make people feel better? Hearing a bird sing? Do animals "like" helping humans in this way?

Preparation

Write names of animals on paper. Draw the picture too, if needed.

How to play:

Preparation
